FACILITY INFORMATION

- Our building is a locked facility. Wait for the receptionist to buzz you in or enter code (emailed out separately).
- Parents are responsible for escorting their children to and from our building.
- We are located in an urban area and request that dancers enter and exit our building with street clothes over their dance uniform.
- There is metered parking right outside of our door. 1 block away you will find free 2 hour parking.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

General School Information

Inclement Weather Policy:

In the event of inclement weather, Columbia Dance will announce any closures by 1pm for weekday classes and by 8pm the evening prior for weekend classes. Announcements will be sent via email and posted to our Facebook page. As our hours are very different from public schools hours, our decision to remain open or closed may differ from those of the academic schools. On occasions when Columbia Dance is able to be open during inclement weather, we will respect any family's decision to keep their child home and will happily excuse them from classes.

Parent Observation Weeks: We have found from experience that students make better progress without parents in the studio. Parents and friends are invited to observe classes twice a year during Parents Observation Week. These weeks are listed on the annual calendar.

Performances All students have the opportunity to perform at the end of the year in our *Spring Showcase*. Students in Level 1A and up, are invited to participate in our annual holiday classic, *The Nutcracker*, performed in December. Our Creative Dance and Pre-Ballet students have the opportunity to take part in an informal studio performance in late November.

Notices & Messages: Email is our primary form of communication. Important school notices and schedules will also be posted on the school bulletin board in the lobby. Students and parents are responsible for checking their email regularly.

Lobby Area: Parents are welcome to watch classes from the lobby. The level of noise in the lobby must be maintained at a low volume. Excess noise can be heard through the classrooms and disrupts the dancers' ability to concentrate. Parents are expected to keep a close eye on their children and not allow them to run around the studios. Please help us keep our lobby clean: pick up after yourselves and dispose of trash and recycling in the respective receptacles.

'No Dogs' policy: All dogs must be on leash or in a carrier and must not pass the slate entryway of Columbia Dance.

Lost and Found: The Lost and Found basket is located in the lobby. Clearly labeled clothing and shoes help to prevent their loss. Please do not leave valuables unattended.

Dressing Rooms: Men's and Women's changing rooms are available. Company members have access to unlocked lockers for dance-related personal items. Please do not leave valuables unattended. That said, all dancers will use only what belongs to them and respect the possessions of others. Behavioral expectations extend across all physical spaces in Columbia Dance—from the studio to dressing rooms; we are an inclusive community of respect and collaboration.

Conferences: Students and parents are welcome to call the school at any time they have questions or concerns. Conferences with faculty can be arranged. Teachers are often scheduled to teach consecutive classes. Instead of talking with faculty members after class, please schedule a separate meeting or phone conference time.

Absences: If your student needs to miss class, we ask that you call (360-737-1922) or email us (info@columbiadance.org) to let us know. If you would like your student to make up the missed class, our front desk staff can advise you as to which classes would be appropriate to make up in.

Tuition: Our tuition price for the 10 month school year is divided into 10 monthly payments. Tuition is withdrawn between the 1st and 5th of each month through our automatic payment system.

Outstanding Balances: Students who carry an unpaid balance on their account for more than 60 days will not be allowed to participate in classes unless payment of the outstanding balance is made in full, or unless suitable arrangements have been made with the School Manager and a good faith effort is being made to pay the balance. Families are welcome to apply for financial aid at any time during the school year if tuition payments become a hardship.

Building Access: Students and parents are only permitted to be in the building when a Columbia Dance staff member is present or if they have made prior arrangements with a staff member (for studio rental or volunteer services). We ask that you do not drop your student off before the building is officially open. Monday-Friday we open at 3:30pm. Saturday we open at 8:30am.

Level 6 and Company: White t-shirt, grey or white tights & white ballet shoes

*Columbia Dance supports our dancers in choosing the dress code option that is right for them.

AUDITIONS & REGISTRATION:

It is our hope that every student in Level 1 and up will participate in our Fort Vancouver themed Nutcracker. Levels 4 and up do not have an audition. Their weekly classes serve as their audition.

*All dancers must be currently enrolled in classes at Columbia Dance Center.

Wardrobe fee: \$65 per performer fee due by September 26th. You will be charged this fee when you log into our parent portal to register. These fees are used for costumes and costume maintenance, make-up, headpieces, and staff rehearsal pay. This is the only fee you will have for Nutcracker. REHEARSAL COMMITMENT

WEEKLY REHEARSALS October 11 – December 13

- Level 3 will rehearse on Friday evenings and some Saturday afternoons
- Level 4 will rehearse on Friday evenings and Saturday afternoons
- Levels 5 and 6 will rehearse during normal class time and most of the day on Saturdays

*You will receive your rehearsal schedule and casting by October 4th

***No rehearsals Nov. 26 - 29 (Thanksgiving weekend)

TECH/DRESS REHEARSALS (subject to change)

VOLUNTEERISM – Volunteer support is crucial to our Nutcracker production. We ask that each family sign up for a minimum of 3 volunteer shifts. There are a variety of jobs, some which can be done at home.

POTENTIAL REHEARSAL CONFLICT? Email becky.moore@columbiadance.org ASAP to explain your conflict and find out if we can work around it. With only 9 Saturdays during Nutcracker season, stellar attendance is crucial for all dancers to feel confident on stage.

OTHER CONSTRAINTS? Casting a production of this scale is incredibly complicated. We ask that you allow our faculty to choose whether your child is in Cast A, Cast B, or in both casts. If you have an extreme situation that requires your child to be in a specific cast, only be in one cast, or needing to be in the same cast as another student, please email becky.moore@columbiadance.org ASAP to explain.

Casting & rehearsal schedule will be announced by October 4th.

Saturday rehearsals will begin October 11th. Please check your email for Nutcracker updates.
